





Down:

- Traditional uses of this tree were butchers chopping blocks, piano hammers and wood screws. It is the hardest wood of any tree in Europe. Used today for furniture.
- The trees leaves, and fruit are toxic to humans, the berries have an laxative effect.
 This tree has a long history with wool.
- 3. This tree was long associated with witchcraft, and it is said that witches' wands and staffs were made using this trees wood.
- 5. This tree is associated with love and marriage. This tree is mentioned in Shakespeare's 'A Midsummer Night's Dream and Love's Labour Lost. It was said that if you throw the pips into the fire while saying the name of your love, the love is true if the pips explode.
- 8. It was thought that if you burned this wood you would see the Devil, but if you planted it by your house it would keep the Devil away. It is also known as the 'Judas tree'

- 4. Branches of this tree hung around a doorway was believed to stop bats entering. Also, by passing it over a child's head was said to remove all traces of witchcraft. Very popular for making instruments.
- 6. It was believed that brining this blossom inside would be followed by illness and death. This blossom marks the point at which Spring turn into Summer.
- 7. This tree was once known as a Magical Tree and Tree of Knowledge. A rod of this tree is supposed to protected against evil spirits and the nuts carried as charms to ward off rheumatism.
- The trees strong bendy stalks were used to tie hay bales and even to make arrows.
 This tree's fruit is used by fairies to make themselves invisible. The root of this tree is also thought to be able to cure the bite of a
